SUN SMART POLICY

This policy is informed by:

- CMS Student Welfare Policy 2015
- Policy on Playground Supervision (reviewed June 2014)
- CMS Duty of Care Policy
- CMS Sun Smart Policy (reviewed June 2014)

Statement:

Canberra Montessori School is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all students and staff and to promote attitudes to skin protection.

Rationale:

The Sun Smart Policy provides guidelines to ensure students and staff have some UV exposure for Vitamin D absorption while ensuring well protected measures are in place when UV levels reach 3 and above. Students are encouraged to independently take sun protection measures underlined by duty of care practice from staff. WHS strategies are followed for safety in the outdoors.

Specific Practices & Procedures:

- A combination of sun protection measures are used for all outdoor activities from 1st August to 31st May and whenever UV levels reach 3 and above.
- Where possible, active, outdoor sun safe play is encouraged throughout the day.

Healthy Social Environment:

- Management ensures a sufficient number of shelters and trees providing shade in the outdoor areas.
- The availability of shade is considered when planning all outdoor activities and excursions.
- Students are encouraged to choose and use available areas of shade when outside.
- Students who do not have appropriate hats or outdoor clothing are asked to choose a shady play space or a suitable area protected from the sun.

Learning and Skills:

- Sun protection and importance of vitamin D are incorporated into the learning and development program.
- The Sun Smart Policy is reinforced through staff and student activities.

Healthy Physical Environment:

When outside, students are required to wear loose fitting clothing that covers as much skin
as possible. If a student is not wearing sun-safe clothing (e.g. a singlet top or shoestring
dress) they will be required to choose a t-shirt/shirt to wear over the top before going
outdoors.

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- Students and staff are required to wear hats that protect their face, neck and ears, i.e. legionnaire, broad-brimmed or bucket hats. Baseball or peak caps are not considered a suitable alternative.
- SPF 30 or higher broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen is supplied by the school and/or families
- Sunscreen is applied at least 20 minutes before going outdoors and reapplied every two hours if outdoors.
- To help develop independent skills, children from 3 years are given opportunities and encouraged to apply their own sunscreen under staff supervision.
- Sun screen is available outside the Cycle 1 classrooms to support application prior to entering the classroom to ensure skin is protected should children choose to work in the outdoors during the morning work cycle.

Monitoring and Review:

- Management and staff monitor and review the effectiveness of the Sun Smart Policy and revise the policy when required (every three years) by completing a policy review and membership renewal with Sun Smart at sunsmart.com.au
- Sun Smart Policy updates and requirements will be made available to staff, families and visitors.
